Outreach Section

- Challenging year due to staff losses
 - Lost four staff over a nine-month period (Connie, Tim, Neal, and Layne)
 - "Outreach Section of One" (Joan) since Sept.
- Outreach Section staffing
 - Joan Snider: acting Outreach Section manager
 - Barry Hefner: new Outreach Specialist
 - Outreach Specialist: December advertisement?



Outreach Section

- Certification courses
 - 2017: Eight courses held (landfill, transfer station, recycling facility, and compost facility)
 - 235 students in 2017
 - 2018: Eight courses planned
 - Landfill: March & September
 - > Transfer station: June & November
 - Recycling: May & December
 - Compost: April & October



Outreach Section

- RAID grants
 - FY18: 27 grants totaling \$670,000
- Annual Reports
 - On-line reporting on hold until staffing improves
 - Hard copy submittals or e-mail (swb.inbox@state.nm.us)



- Staffing levels
 - Four of five Enforcement Officer positions filled
 - EA-I (central counties): Paul Martinez and Dan Galasso
 - EA-II (NE counties): <u>vacant</u>
 - EA-III (southern counties): Ryan McBee
 - EA-IV (NW and western counties): Ty Jameson



- Formal enforcement actions (Orders issued)
 - Unique Automotive Service Center
 - Tire generator
 - Failure to assure proper tire disposal; failure to produce records
 - Assessed penalty: \$17,500
 - Respondent failed to pay despite Order to do so from District Court
 - District Court Order has been appealed, claiming NMED lacks jurisdiction

- Formal enforcement actions (Orders issued)
 - Big John's Mobile Tire Shredding
 - Failure to maintain scrap tire hauler bond
 - Tire hauler registration revoked, no Penalty assessed
 - Case closed
 - Michael D. Porter
 - 1,200 to 1,500 scrap tires disposed on residential property
 - Assessed Penalty: \$9,000; no response
 - Case open



- Formal enforcement actions (Orders issued)
 - Unregistered collection centers (2), Mora County
 - Penalty of \$7,000 paid, case closed
 - Unregistered collection center, Village of Magdalena
 - Penalty of \$1,250 paid, case closed
 - Unregistered recycling facility, City of Socorro
 - Penalty of \$2,300 paid, case closed



- Informal enforcement actions (e.g., NOVs)
 - ENTS complaints logged: 85
 - ENTS complaints resolved: 61
 - ENTS complaints open: 24



- Gallup-McKinley County Schools
 - October 11, 2011: SWB received complaint alleging burial of various wastes behind GMCS Operations & Maintenance Building in Gallup
 - December 19, 2011: NOV issued
 - February 21, 2012: Site Characterization and Excavation Plans approved
 - February 28, 2012: KEERS began site excavation



- Gallup-McKinley County Schools
 - Excavated waste included:
 - 280 cubic yards of scrap metal
 - 395 cubic yards of PCS
 - One cubic yard of regulated asbestos waste
 - Six compressed gas cylinders
 - One approximate 4,000 gallon diesel fuel tank
 - One approximate 2,000 gallon fuel tank
 - Motor oil, lead acid batteries, two 30 pound Freon containers, PCBlight ballasts
 - Four drums of solidified roof coating (lead hazard)
 - Five gallon container of mercury thermostats
 - Large stainless steel commercial fire suppressant tank
 - 28 tons of C&D debris and student records




























- Gallup-McKinley County Schools
 - USEPA Region 6 notified SWB that criminal charges would not be pursued due to evidentiary issues
 - 2015-2016: various NMED/GMCS meetings resulted in agreement that GMCS would perform additional site characterization [and excavation, if deemed necessary]
 - GMCS officials completed additional site characterization [included investigative trenching]
 - July 20, 2017: GMCS Phase 2 Investigative Report approved, with no additional solid waste discovered
 - August 10, 2017: case closed

Permit Section

Recent Permitting Actions

- □ Five permit application hearings in 2017:
 - McKinley County Transfer Station
 - Buckman Road Recycling & Transfer Facility
 - Town of Vaughn Landfill
 - Otero/Greentree Regional Landfill
 - Sandoval County Solid Waste Regional Center
- Four permits issued to date (McKinley County TS; BuRRT; Vaughn LF, OGRLF), permit for SCSWRC to be issued before end of year.

Current Permitting Actions

- Edith Transfer Station, ABQ
 - SWB reviewing response to 1st RAI.
- Stericycle Infectious Waste Processing Facility (autoclave)
 - SWB reviewing response to 1st RAI.
- E-Strategy Total Waste Solutions (autoclave)
 - SWB reviewing initial application.
- Lea County Regional Landfill
 - Permit renewal/modification application to be submitted in December 2017.

Other Activities

Closed landfill reviews

- Approximately 110 closed landfills
- CPCC Plans approved?
- Closure (final cover construction) approved?
- 2017: Two CPCC Plans approved and seven closure certificates issued
- Resumption of GW sampling at two closed landfills



Unlined Landfill Closures

- Several "dumplings" received final cover over past 12-18 months.
 - Vaughn LF: final cover completed June 2017
 - NMSU LF: final cover completed November 2016
 - Raton LF: final cover completed September 2016
 - Reserve LF: final cover completed April 2016
- One "dumpling" still needing completion of final cover: Deming LF
 - February 2017: Revised closure design



Post-closure care

- Initially required by 1989 SWMR
- 25 years (closure pursuant to 1989 and 1991 SWMR)
- 30 years (closure pursuant to 1994/1995 SWMR and 2007 SWR)
- Post-Closure Care Report required after expiration of postclosure care period
- Post-closure care period terminated upon written verification from NMED Secretary that all post-closure care requirements have been met



- Some landfills with 25-year post closure periods have reached the end of the PCC period
- Dilemma: What happens when problems remain at end of PCC period?



- South Broadway Landfill
 - Closed in 1989
 - 25-year post-closure care period expired in 2014
 - 2000: Concert venue (currently Isleta Amphitheater) opened on adjacent parcel
 - Between 1996 and 2002: Water tank constructed adjacent to landfill
 - 2004: Approval granted for construction of road across landfill to provide additional access to concert venue

- South Broadway Landfill
 - January 2015: SWB staff conducted post-closure care inspection
 - Evidence of water flowing from water tank across closed disposal cells in vicinity of access road
 - High levels of methane in shallow subsurface adjacent to access road
 - Area adjacent to access road used for concert parking and related activities

- South Broadway Landfill
 - January 2015: SWB staff conducted post-closure care inspection
 - Substantial erosion of northern slope of closed disposal cell

- South Broadway Landfill
 - SWB did not issue verification of PCC completion due to methane and erosion issues
 - Bernalillo County response:
 - Locked gates installed at each end of access road (road use restricted to event staff only)
 - "No Parking" signs and fencing along access road to prohibit parking
 - County staff present during concert events to ensure no parking occurs adjacent to access road

- South Broadway Landfill
 - Bernalillo County response:
 - Surficial methane sampling adjacent to access road prior to concert events
 - Sign to be installed at water tank stating no water discharges shall be made onto landfill
 - Repaired north slope of disposal cell
 - Installed drainage channel to ensure stormwater no longer runs down north slope



- South Broadway Landfill
 - Further actions:
 - Bernalillo County will submit a supplement to Post-Closure Care Report documenting additional access control and monitoring activities
 - SWB will issue verification of post-closure care completion contingent upon continued concert event monitoring and final cover inspections
