Tire grants and County funds

Since 2010 our office will have cleaned up approximately 60,000+ illegally dumped tires and 60+ acres by utilizing NMED tire grant funds and County funds.

- We have learned how to effectively write grant requests to get NMED money
- Our office utilized \$6000 in County clean up funds to offer a tire amnesty program for a month in 2013

Abandoned and dilapidated mobile homes

Since 2010 we have forced removal of 120+ mobile homes and have about another 20+ in the process of removal where illegal activity, illegal dumping and tire dumping have taken place.
